

Tania Bodsworth, Vice President of GYWI, has been working on a resolution for the National Campaign for 2022 and would like your support.

The resolution asks NFWI to call upon the Government to ask NatWest (and all banks) to reject their proposal of introducing bank charges on all Registered Charitable Accounts, to ensure all bank services are provided adequately and appropriately free of charge.

CERVICAL SCREENING AWARENESS CAMPAIGN – from 7 June

Guernsey Public

Health is launching a Cervical Screening Awareness Campaign starting on 7 June. In the Bailiwick cervical cancer accounts for approximately 1-2 deaths per year, with an estimated 5 new cases diagnosed annually.

It is reported that approximately 70% of patients diagnosed with cervical cancer over a 3 year period (2016-2018), have either never been screened or have not had regular screening but we know that cervical cancer is one of the most preventable cancers. Regular cervical screening protects against the development of 75% of cervical cancers.

Our Cervical screening programme is for women and anyone with a cervix. Those aged 25-49 should attend every three years, and those aged 50-65 every five years.

It is very rare to develop cervical cancer under the age of 25 and over the age of 65, if a woman has had regular cervical screening. The aim of the programme is to reduce the incidence of and mortality from cervical cancer and the service has been **FREE since 2019**. Cervical screening can be done at a GP practice, Choices or the Orchard Centre.

The target for cervical screening coverage stands at 80% for both age ranges. As of March 2021, the

estimated coverage in the Bailiwick stands at only 60% for 25-49 year olds and 63.5% for 50-65 year-olds. This decline is mirrored nationally and is, to some extent, to be expected due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The campaign highlights the risks of cervical cancer and the preventative benefits of screening, encouraging women of all ages to respond to their letter and if they have missed previous invites, to book a screening appointment.

It provides an opportunity to improve people's understanding of cervical screening and have a long-lasting impact on the number of women who choose to attend their screening appointment.

In 2019 the WI launched the campaign "5 minutes that matter" and this year the resolution relates to ovarian cancer. The Community Affairs committee is looking to organise a local events to support both and encourage women to attend appointments.

They work very closely with other professionals like speech and language, occupational therapy, physio and the two school nurses that work in the special needs schools.
